



Coastal Strategies Secures Funding for New Jersey Coastal Coalition Tidal Flooding Study

Coastal Strategies is pleased to announce the award of \$75,000 to the New Jersey Coastal Coalition (NJCC) to conduct a Corps of Engineers study that will identify high-risk areas for flooding in Ocean and Cape May Counties and provide potential solutions. NJCC is a 501(c)(3) Charitable Trust incorporated in the State of New Jersey and dedicated to assisting municipalities and their residents with flood mitigation issues. Coastal Strategies was hired as a lead consultant to identify a funding source for a study that would document the cause of the high frequency tidal flooding problems in 13 municipalities, including the identification of potential measures to address the problems, an evaluation of the feasibility of remedial measures, and potential preliminary conceptual solutions. Coastal Strategies coordinated a joint partnership between the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the Corps of Engineers, Philadelphia District to fund and study the problem. The municipalities included in the study are Egg Harbor Township, Ocean City, Upper Township, Sea Isle City, Avalon, Stone Harbor, North Wildwood, West Wildwood, Wildwood Crest, Cape May City, Cape May Point, Downe Township, and Woodbridge Township.

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
